WARWICK & HANBURY HALL (NT)



A chance to see some of Warwick's sights such as the historic Lord Leycester Hospital. Dating from 14th century with its 12th century chapel next door, these amazing buildings housed the city's medieval guilds and were and still are a place of retirement for old soldiers.

Or you can explore some of the quirky streets with their independent shops, and visit the Mill garden by the river at the foot of Warwick castle.

Hanbury is a large stately home built in c1701 surrounded by parkland and both formal and 'relaxed' gardens, including an orangery and a walled garden. The house contains original wall paintings, full of politics and drama, which show the birth of Georgian society.
