EXBURY GARDENS & BUCKLER'S HARD (with river cruise)



EXBURY is a 200-acre woodland garden, often considered the finest example of its type in the UK. Created by Lionel de Rothschild in the 1920s, it is home to a large collection of rhododendrons, azaleas and camellias. Visitors can take a ride on the narrow-gauge steam railway through the gardens and there is a restaurant serving hot meals and a café for lighter refreshments.



BUCKLER'S HARD is a unique 18th-century shipbuilding village on the banks of the Beaulieu River where ships for Nelson's navy were built. Discover its history in the maritime museum and in the reconstructed cottage displays. We have a river cruise here. There are plenty of eating places and you can have everything from pub meals to cream teas!
